



## Lynne Dick Horning '56

Lynne Dick Horning is an accomplished artist and community activist who has had significant influence on many persons, especially children, in both Washington, DC and in Telluride, Colorado.

Lynne graduated from Dunbarton College with a BA in Art History. She has studied ceramics and is a potter who has exhibited in numerous shows. She is a partner in the Troyer Art Gallery in Washington, DC and former owner of an independent bookstore in Telluride.

A passionate supporter of the arts, Lynne has worked with the Levine School of Music to increase its outreach to children. Through her generosity and work, the Levine School and the Calvary Bilingual Multicultural Learning Center developed an early childhood music program at the Center. She has served on the board of the New City

Museum and was involved with the Sitar Center which provides music and dance to children in one of DC's poorest neighborhoods. Lynne has served on the boards of numerous organizations including the Capital Area Community Food Bank, For Love of Children, and the non-profit Ah Haa School for the Arts. Her volunteer work includes serving as pianist and accompanist for the Sheridan School Choral and helping at Christ House, a residential health facility for homeless men.

Lynne married Joseph Horning in 1961. In 1990, they established the Horning Family Fund. The fund focuses on Ward 8 in DC to address the disparity of opportunities and services for children and their families. Lynne and Joe were recognized as Washingtonians of the Year in 2002. This award honors those who make Washington a better place and inspire others to do the same. Lynne and Joe have four children and nine grandchildren.
